Commissioner Boyd, again stated Commissioner MacNeill said he wouldn't use more money. Commissioner MacNeill stated he changed his mind and the parks benefit everyone. Commissioner Boyd stated she would like to see improvements to the Municipal Building, the front stairs are in need of repair.

HEARING OF CITIZENS

REPORTS

Commissioner Boyd inquired if closing dates have been determined for the Challenger Road properties with KABR. Mr. Boggia advised no date has been set as of yet. Commissioner Boyd stated she is receiving complaints about the condition of 2 Edison Street. Since the Village passed an ordinance addressing property maintenance, why hasn't this property been addressed? Commissioner MacNeill advised once contractor fees are obtained, the process can begin.

Mayor Fosdick advised the energy audits for the firehouses have been completed. Lime Energy will pay 70% and the firehouses will be responsible for the other 30%. There will be a Circus in the County Park from June 12th through June 15th. Chief Rose stated protestors may be present at the event. On July 10th, Joe Gilligan, "Touch of Sinatra" will be performing at the Library. Mayor Fosdick inquired about Matrix. Commissioner MacNeill advised they applied to the DEP for the landfill permit and are trying to step away from the PILOT Program. Commissioner Boyd stated there are different types of programs. Mayor Fosdick would like to see a comparison between what Matrix is proposing to the Village's program.

Chief Rose advised the Juvenile State Justice Commission had inspected the Police Department facilities. There will be mandated upgrades since standards have changed. Cost to be determined.
