DISCUSSION I

Bill Betesh, Esq. and Arthur Carlson, Tax Assessor were present to discuss the status of Tax Appeals. There are currently two appeals that have not been settled and sent to the Commissioners for approval – Multicultural Radio and 105 Challenger Road. Commissioner Boyd stated resolutions have been approved on all tax appeal settlements that have already been presented. Mr. Betesh advised the appeal for 100 Challenger Road is scheduled for trial on June 2 and June 3rd. The court will determine the current market value which will be used as a precedent for future appeals. The assessment now reflects a value of \$135 per square foot. Mr. Betesh is hopeful the courts will assess at \$125 per square foot, yielding a \$100,000.00 refund. The Village will have 120 days from the judgement date to process the refund. Office space market is not doing well while the residential market has improved slightly.

Mr. Betesh and Mr. Carlson left the meeting at 6:30 pm.

DISCUSSION II

Matrix Development

Donald Epstein, Richard Johnson and Gerry Salerno were present to discuss their development proposal regarding the Challenger Road Development.

Mr. Johnson reviewed Matrix's proposal. A midrise 8 story residential building with a parking deck is designed for 100 Challenger Road. Amenities would include a courtyard, pool, and rooftop terrace. 95 Challenger Road would have a podium building with 1 level of parking and 3 levels of residential construction. Mr. Johnson advised Matrix is aware a Land Disturbance Permit must be obtained and are prepared to go through the 120 day due diligence period. They are aware of the geotechnical issues of the site and want to make sure the studies are done correctly. The Commissioners will be informed of all findings and issues as they happen. The Ridgefield Park development will be Matrix's main priority.

Mayor Fosdick agreed it is important for the Board to be informed with any issues as they happen. The Commissioners will be meeting with three other developers.

Mr. Johnson pledged an MOU – Memorandum of Understanding. While every project has challenges, Matrix will find solutions. They are ready to go.

Mr. Epstein, Mr. Johnson and Mr. Salerno left the meeting at 8:05 pm.

HEARING OF CITIZENS

No public present

REPORTS

Commissioner Boyd advised the tax collection rate is higher (98.19) than any time since 2009. At the recommendations of Vince Buono, Tax Collector, the Village should consider foreclosing on their two municipal liens. Commissioner Boyd inquired about the status of Starplex utilizing the Village lot for parking. Mr. Boggia will send correspondence to Starplex. Documentation on the 2014 budget was distributed noting no municipal increase. Commissioner Boyd does not agree with a \$30,000 increase for property maintenance, burden will be on the taxpayers. Commissioner MacNeill stated the program will pay for itself; an ordinance will need to be adopted. Mayor Fosdick added a funding mechanism needs to be in place. The budget will be introduced on Tuesday, March 11, 2014.

March 6, 2014

Commissioner Anlian advised health benefits for the two part time professionals will continue. However, effective July 1, 2014, the Village will only cover the employee. Any dependents will be the responsibility of the employee. Commissioner Anlian stated full time employees wishing to opt out of medical benefits should receive an annual monetary incentive. Mr. Boggia will research. Skymark made revisions to their redevelopment plans and are more in line with the Environmental Commission recommendations.

Mayor Fosdick advised the Elk's Citizen of the Year Dinner is Saturday, March 15th. Larry Stefanile, Grantsman, is working on an Energy Audit. The new fire truck will be delivered in approximately 18 months. Mayor Fosdick may not be in attendance at the March 25th meeting.

Clerk O'Grady advised the public hearing on the two ordinances introduced on February 25 will on March 25, 2014.

Attorney Boggia advised the land auction will be held on March 21, 2014.
