COMMISSIONERS CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES RIDGEFIELD PARK March 18, 2021 7:00 PM

HEARING OF CITIZENS

No citizens present.

REPORTS

Commissioner Portorreal stated she referred the Veterans Park project to Ken Ochab. The Pool Commission needs more members if anyone knows anyone that is interested to let her know. The Municipal Building roof repair will cost approx. \$4,000.00. The sewer line issue – the line has been cleared and waiting to replace damaged materials.

Commissioner Gerken stated the shared services agreement with Ridgefield for child vaccinations will be re-written to reflect a \$500 administrative cost and \$40 per vaccine. The fireworks issue has not been resolved since the 4th of July Committee did not meet in January or February – no one to coordinate the fireworks.

Commissioner MacNeill stated the budget sheets are out – check them and will discuss in April.

Mayor Anlian advised 3 of the 6 firehouses are opposed to the centralized firehouse – not feasible for the Commissioners to move ahead at this time. Issues raised at their meeting with the "south" zone companies – loss of volunteers, long tradition of individual fire companies, comradery, Hose 4 response time increased significantly, rent payment increase, capital improvements, stipends. He will schedule a meeting with Chief Antola, Mike Alberque, Bill Lynn, and the captains of each firehouse. The Village still has the opportunity to purchase 78 Mt. Vernon Street. Phi Boggia advised he is waiting on the parking lot draft from Boswell Engineering.

Clerk O'Grady inquired if a decision has been made to move forward with Munisite. Phil Boggia stated there may be proposed legislation that needs to be looked into – preventing companies to monopolize. Hook & Ladder Co. No. 1 submitted a request to close Garden Street on Friday, April 2nd for their annual Fish & Chips dinner – take out only. Resolution to be prepared for the March 23rd meeting.

Superintendent Monroe asked if ok to process the \$3,500 payment for Hackensack roofing – Commissioner Portorreal advised yes. Grant paperwork is in Mayor Anlian's mailbox for signature.

Attorney Boggia advised he drafted a letter to Senator Sarlo, reminding him that he offered to help the Village with the loss of tax revenue, for Mayor Anlian to review and sign.
