<u>REPORTS</u>

Commissioner Boyd reported: The Bergen County Utilities Authority sent notification that municipalities may charge commercial sewer user fees and a sewer tax for tax exempt properties.

Commissioner Poli reported: The senior citizens would like to know if the Village will be contributing to their annual Christmas Party this year.

The Board of Commissioners reached consensus to contribute between \$750.00 and \$900.00 depending on budget available. Contribution should come from recreation budget.

Commissioner MacNeill reported: The Clean Energy Grant should provide \$50,000.00 for the furnace at the Civic Center, Lights at the Sports Center on Preston Street, and lights at the Department of Public Works.

Village Attorney William Betesh reported: It has been confirmed that 105 Challenger Road building was returned the lender. He received a call from a broker, Newmark, regarding the RFP for redevelopment of Challenger Road. He then asked the Commissioners if they would like the RFP for Challenger Road to have a 2084 expiration date on the lease in order to have all leases expiring at the same time or would they prefer to leave the 99 year lease. The deposition for 85 Challenger Road tax appeal scheduled for tomorrow.

The Board of Commissioners reached consensus to leave the 99 year lease in the RFP.

Commissioner Anlian Reported: He spoke to Matt McArrow regarding the change in health insurance for employees; more information should be available next week.

Mayor Fosdick reported: The Fire Department Dinner is Saturday evening at 7:00, Street Fair is Saturday beginning at 10:00 a.m., the 1921 plaque will be rededicated on November 11, 2010, and also on November 11th will be the Masons 100th anniversary dinner. He then asked what was being done regarding a Christmas Tree. It was agreed a large fresh tree will be used. He also shared a summary of the conference he attended with Commissioner MacNeill. There will be a hard 2% cap next year. The three items outside the cap are, debt service, pension benefits (it is not clear if this includes health benefits), and capital expenditures.

Interim Village Clerk Deborah Fehre – She has been in touch with the risk manager regularly to ensure that the Village is up to date regarding the change in health insurance. October 26, 2010

DPW Superintendent Alan O'Grady reported: The bid process should begin regarding the Veterans Park Multi-purpose Field. It is a \$400,000.00 project; \$141,000.00 is a matching grant from Bergen County. The remaining funding has been applied for through Green Acres.

Commissioner Boyd cautioned against spending money even with bonds and grants. Commissioner Anlian noted that the Village spends the project money, receives it back, then spends again and continues to be reimbursed.

Police Captain John DiNiro reported: The police are prepared for the Fall Festival on Saturday. They are also participating in the funeral detail for the Teaneck officer who passed away. The Police Memorial Monument on Euclid Avenue was vandalized extensively.
