Mayor Fosdick advised the sale of Challenger Road properties to Avalon Bay would add approximately 16-18 million dollars in revenue. There would be no tax impact if the sale completes. If not, the tax impact would not occur for a few years.

DISCUSSION

Jim Ruff, Stephen Quinn, Kevin Avery, Peter Garvey and Harry Menta from the Environmental Commission were present to discuss the Eagle's nest.

The Mayor thanked the Commission members for coming. He stated there are concerns the Board of Commissioners are not cognizant of all issues pertaining to the Eagle's nest. He added the Board of Commissioners should be corresponding with potential developers since they are responsible for establishing policies for the Village.

Stephen Quinn, 30 year planning board member and liaison to the Environmental Commission, stated the Environmental Commission believes Skymark can maintain the eagle's nest as well as their intended goals for development. The Environmental Commission has a scheduled meeting with Skymark and Langan Engineering on October 23rd to discuss two proposals. The first proposes subdividing the property to include the nest and the protected wetlands creating "Skymark Eagle Preserve." The second would call for the same subdivision if Skymark is mandated by the NJDEP to cut down the tree due to soil contaminants. Once the area is cleared and capped, planting of the same fast-growing cottonwood trees would re-create the original nest site habitat.

Skymark and the Environmental Commission both agree the 50'-100' steel tower the NJDEP is proposing would probably not work and ultimately become an eyesore.

Mayor Fosdick thanked the Environmental Commission members for coming and providing a better understanding of the issues regarding the eagle's nest.

ADJOURNMENT

On a motion by Commissioner Anlian, seconded by Commissioner Boyd that the meeting be adjourned.
