RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN APPEAL TO APPELLATE DIVISION RE: VILLAGE OF RIDGEFIELD PARK V. OUTFRONT MEDIA, LLC

WHEREAS, The Village of Ridgefield Park has continuously opposed the site plan application filed with the Bogota Joint Planning and Zoning Board commencing in 2015 which seeks approval for a billboard on 261 North Ave., Bogota, NJ. The proposed billboard is less than 50 feet from residential homes in the Village of Ridgefield Park; and

WHEREAS, after initially denying the approval for a billboard in 2015, the Joint Bogota Planning and Zoning Board reversed itself and approved the billboard application in 2019. This approval was appealed to the Superior Court of New Jersey, who upheld the approval in November 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Village wishes to appeal the decision of the Superior Court to the new Jersey Appellate Division; and

WHEREAS, the Village believes that it is in the best interest of the residents of the Village to protect their neighborhoods against intrusive and oversized billboards like the one proposed on North Avenue;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Village if Ridgefield Park hereby authorizes the appeal to the New Jersey Appellate Division challenging the approval of the billboard application and the Village further authorizes Stephan F. Pellino, Esq. to represent the Village in this appeal as he has done throughout these legal proceedings.

Mr. Pellino shall keep the Village Attorney informed of the status of these proceedings and provide him with copies of all pleadings that are filed in connection with the appeal.
