- Will have a trivia game for kids and adults highest points eligible for prize. Will pick up a few prizes like bird whistle, binoculars, etc. Adults could get an NP hat or t-shirt. Key Club will help with contest.
- Members should meet at Riverfront Park at 8:30 a.m. to help with set-up. (Harry Menta unavailable.)
- Key Club members will have their own table and will also help out at the event. Will use some students
 as Mr. Softee Police to make sure it's only one ice cream per person up to \$500. Can also help with
 Riverkeeper's eco-cruises if needed.
- Traffic problem suggestion use one or two adults. Three areas: 1) the event area that would be parked from start to finish, 2) the long-term staying and they may be stuck for a while in our lot. And then 3) the ones that are running out can park in front of the salt silo.
- Mayor Anlian to do robocall and also have text, emails sent day before to remind people of event and suggest carpooling, walking, or biking to event.
- Will order bagels for breakfast from Java Day and sandwiches from IGA.
- Nature Walk April 22 at Nature Preserve 9:00 a.m. 11:00 a.m. review.
 - About 25 people attended, went very well.
 - May 27 will be the next nature walk because there are new things in bloom now.
- Eagles SQ received a call from Don Torino, the president of the Bergen County Audubon Society, that there have been trespassers onto the old Skymark property who have been photographing and shooting video of the nesting. Bald Eagles directly under the nest and, as a result, harassing the nesting birds. This is in violation of both State and Federal law. No one, by law, should be within 1,000 feet of an active Bald Eagles nest. Kevin Avery and Jim Macaluso installed the signs with Don Torino since Steve was sick.

Nature Preserve:

- 5/25 will be date of next Nature Walk
- Commissioner Gerken working on directional signs to Nature Preserve at Teaneck Road & East Grand Avenue
- Commissioner Gerken, Mayor Anlian and Steve Quinn spoke with a mosquito entomologist from the county. They
 agreed to allow helicopter spraying with larvicide, which just targets mosquitoes and nothing else due to diseases
 such as West Nile Virus.
- June 3 ribbon cutting ceremony.
 - o EC can use the parking lot.
 - o Ask Mark Olson if EC can use his sandwich signs on opening day to help visitors locate Nature Preserve
 - Ordering boxed water
 - Commissioner Gerken has hedge clippers for the cutting.
 - o Commissioner Gerken has said he could get the ribbon for the ceremony- check with Dayle if necessary.
 - Podium, sound system, chairs will notify DPW.
 - o Invitations mailed. Invitations to the public has been posted on social media Village Facebook and Instagram. Flyers will be distributed in schools. Posted on Eventbrite as well.
 - o Program for event Steve will speak to Harry Menta and then Mayor Anlian, who will be the MC.
 - Teddy Roosevelt cutout has arrived.
 - DPW event form will be submitted.
 - o EC will confirm that Don Torino is aware anyone in the BCAS can attend the grand opening.

New Business:

Volunteer Day at Nature Preserve:

Certain aspects of Stacey's job really demands more than one person. The EC will ask the Social Media Manager to post that Thursday mornings from 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. will be volunteer day. Steve will check with Mayor Anlian if Thursdays should be only over age 18 or not so Stacey does not have the responsibility of supervising students. Steve will review the post before it goes up.

• There is a large Great Egret and Snowy Egret (big white herons) roost (a few dozen birds) on the banks of the Overpeck Creek on the Samsung property. Samsung has, evidently, been cutting the trees and threatening the birds - possibly unknowingly. Egrets are not endangered species, so we cannot stop them

through State or Federal Law, so SQ thought a polite and thoughtful request and appeal to their environmental sensibilities might be the best way to proceed. The letter was sent.
