A Resolution Awarding a Contract to Boswell Engineering, Inc. for the Preparation of Specifications, Plans, and Construction Inspection for the Road Resurfacing Project RP 768, Main Street from Summit Street to North Avenue

WHEREAS, The Village of Ridgefield Park has been selected to receive funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) Municipal Aid Program for road resurfacing for Main Street from Summit Street to North Avenue, in the amount of \$293,380.00 toward the construction costs of \$345,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Village Engineer, Boswell Engineering, Inc. (the "Professional"), has submitted a proposal dated November 30, 2022, a copy of which is on file with the Village Clerk, to prepare specifications, plans, and construction inspection for the Village pursuant to the scope of work set forth therein, for the estimated price not to exceed \$27,000.00 for the design phase and \$40,000.00 for the inspection phase of the project; and

WHEREAS, the award of a contract to a licensed professional is exempt from public bidding requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5; and

WHEREAS, this contract has been awarded under the "alternative process" pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 19:44A-20.4 et seq. (the "Pay-to-Play Law"), and has been awarded to Professional based upon the merits and abilities of Professional to provide the services necessary; and

WHEREAS, Professional has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that Professional has not made any reportable contributions to a political candidate or candidate committee in the Village of Ridgefield Park in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit Professional from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Village Chief Financial Officer has certified that funds have been appropriated
and are available for this purpose in account number

(the "Professional"), has submitted a proposal dated February 14, 2023, a copy of which is on file with the Village Clerk, to prepare specifications, plans, and construction inspection for the Village pursuant to the scope of work set forth therein, for the estimated price not to exceed \$9,500.00 for the design phase and \$22,500.00 for the inspection phase of the project; and

WHEREAS, the award of a contract to a licensed professional is exempt from public bidding requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5; and

Resolution 2023-40

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey's liquor license laws date back to the 1950s and 1960s; and

WHEREAS, under current law, a municipality may issue plenary retail consumption licenses until the combined total number in the municipality is fewer than one license for each 3,000 municipal residents and this restriction creates a shortage of these licenses in some municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey's liquor license laws has caused an extreme supply imbalance that the statewide average cost of an individual liquor license is \$300,000, an exorbitant amount causing an inequitable landscape among current and potential restaurateurs; and

WHEREAS, the restaurant liquor license standards of other states in the Northeast region enable restaurateurs to join the market at a significantly lower price point than the State of New Jersey, thus giving them a competitive advantage; and

WHEREAS, in today's market, small business and downtown economic development thrive best where there is a healthy full-service restaurant market; and

WHEREAS, there is clear need for reform as demonstrated by the numerous bills already introduced in the New Jersey Legislature each session with the intent to expand liquor licensure; and

WHEREAS, Governor Murphy affirmed his commitment to reform in his State of the State address on January 10, 2023 with a draft plan to make it more equitable to obtain a new liquor license while providing compensation to existing active license holders; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the need to compensate existing license holders that paid exorbitant prices for the right to sell liquor in their restaurants; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey should be a leader in reform initiatives that helps its small businesses survive and thrive, provides an equitable business environment, and enables New Jersey to better compete in the regional market.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Village of Ridgefield Park that it supports meaningful liquor license reform legislation to create a more balanced liquor license market; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Village Clerk be and hereby is authorized to distribute copies of this Resolution to all appropriate officials and agencies including our Legislative Representatives, the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

WHEREAS, Governor Philip Murphy and the New Jersey State Legislature created Revolution NJ in 2018 to plan, encourage, develop, and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States, New Jersey's pivotal role in the American Revolution, and the contributions of its diverse peoples to the nation's past, present, and future; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will engage New Jerseyans in all 21 counties and 564 municipalities through its officially recognized programs, initatives, and events over the next ten years; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and desirable that we commemorate the beginning of the Nation and the role New Jersey played over the past 250 years as well as its present and future role as part of the United States, with particular focus on the individuals, ideas, and events that shaped our Country, State and Ridgefield Park; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will consider the role New Jersey played during the American Revolution when it saw more battles and skirmishes than any other state and was truly the Crossroads of the American Revolution; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will highlight the role New Jerseyans played beyond the battlefield during the American Revolution when people of diverse backgrounds contributed to the development of the State and the Nation in various ways and fought for the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

WHEREAS, preserving, studying, and enjoying state history strengthens communities and builds bonds between New Jersey residents as we work together toward the goals of justice and equality embedded in the United States Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Ridgefield Park hereby endorses RevolutionNJ and its mission to advance the role that history plays in public discourse, community engagement, education, tourism and scholarship in New Jersey.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that:

- 1. The Board of Commissioners commemorates the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the United States as an independent Nation.
- 2. The Board of Commissioners authorizes the appointment of a committee to develop a plan for this commemoration that will promote the maximum involvement of our residents, neighborhoods, businesses, schools, civic organizations, and institutions in the commemorations.
- 3.
