# GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year ended December 31, 2022 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Village Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

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R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Village of the Ridgefield Park, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

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WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-87 (Chapter 159, P.L. 1948) provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the Budget of any Municipality when such item shall have been made available by law and the amount thereof was not determined at the time of adoption of the Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Ridgefield Park received \$12,995.20 from the National Opioids Settlement Fund and wishes to amend its 2023 Budget to include a portion of this amount as an item of revenue,

# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPOINTMENT OF MUNICIPAL REPRESENTATIVES TO THE BERGEN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT REGIONAL COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Village of Ridgefield Park has entered into a three (3) year Cooperative Agreement with the County of Bergen as provided under the Interlocal Services Act N.J.S.A. 40A:8a-1 et seq. and Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement requires that the Municipal Governing Body appoint a representative and alternate for the FY 2023-2024 term starting July 1, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2024.

#### **RESOLUTION 2023-132**

WHEREAS, the Village of Ridgefield Park will be hosting their annual Street Fair/Jazz Festival on Saturday, October 7, 2023 from 10:00 AM until 5:00 PM; and

WHEREAS, the Village will also be hosting the Bergen County Busking Festival on Saturday, September 30, 2023 from 12:00 PM until 8:00 PM; and

WHEREAS, the Village would like to permit the limited consumption of alcoholic beverages at these two events; and

WHEREAS, Village Ordinance 113-20 does not permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on public streets in the Central Business District except as otherwise provided in 113-21, which does permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages for "block party" events throughout the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village has deemed the annual Street Fair/Jazz Festival and the Busking Festival as qualifying as a block party event in order to permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has no objection to issuance of a block party permit for the above two events; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners authorized the issuance of a block party permit for the Bergen County Busking Festival on Saturday, September 30, 2023 and the Annual Street Fair and Jazz Festival on Saturday, October 7, 2023, subject to the terms and conditions set forth above.
